- *Presbyterian Women are now incorporated giving PW oversight of, among other things, our finances.
- *Look for your Fall gatherings to bring new ideas and information from the gathering.
- *The Great Room was a great room! Besides the PC(USA) organizations, it had a wonderful Global Marketplace. I hope your gatherings will include mini-global marketplaces. There were wonderful items that can be obtained from, to name a few, South America, Thailand (whose women made our gathering bags), Africa, Pakistan and Palestine. It is a wonderful way to do your holiday shopping AND provide hope and \$\$ to women and children.
- *The CCT will be meeting in August. Watch for Virginia Champlin's report shortly after the conclusion of the meeting.
- *There are plans to hold another training event, date/place TBD, similar to the one held in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Three new participants are to be selected from each Synod.
- *PW's current focus is also on involving "newly retired" women.
- *I attended the Network Leadership forum and have a sheet of ideas for involving young and newly retired women. It will be available at the PW Synod of the Northeast moderator's training. If you would like a copy prior to that time, please contact me.

PW SYNOD MODERATORS' TRAINING is scheduled for the second weekend in November (6/7) in Albany, NY. Time will be structured into the training to do more planning for your PPG gatherings in 2010. Watch for more specific information from our Moderator, Sandy Grillo.

TOGETHER IN SERVICE

Together in Service is our Presbyterian Women's hands-on Mission Opportunities program. The focus was changed at the 2006 Churchwide Gathering. This gives women the opportunity to be more creative in the Mission they do locally and around the world. Instead of assignments being given to fulfill missions at various places here and abroad, it permits the women to provide for missions most meaningful for their group.

It is important to remember all projects are sent directly to your project recipient and not to me. A report and/or photos of unique mission projects/events are needed. This way others may have ideas for their projects they wish to begin.

Responses were not gathered from many of the presbyteries in our Synod but the mission you are doing is wide and varied. It will be too numerous to list every project, I will attempt to summarize the compilation I have received from the Presbyteries.

Many PW groups are continuing to participate in Church World Service kit projects, the Heifer Project, Food Pantry project, shelter projects, helping low income college students, PW Networkers, Interreligious/Interfaith groups, Shelter contributions, sponsoring a family or children, Soup kitchen volunteering, all of the offering of Presbyterian Women and the PC(USA), sending diapers to Honduras, caring for divorce support group, various walks, like Crop Walk and blood bank walks, preparing or putting on Thanksgiving dinner for those who have no one to share the holiday with, Original T-bag Ministry, collecting box tops for schools and one for the Menaul School in New Mexico

and one in Appalachia, the Armenian Missionary Association of America, contributing to help abused women and children, contributing to a Dress for Success program, an underwear project for a shelter in Harlem, NY and many more projects.

Some of the hands-on projects are: It appears there are many groups knitting prayer shawls for various groups ranging from cancer victims to long term hospitalized persons or grieving persons and others. Another popular knitting project is knitting caps for babies and preemies at local hospitals, and Heart to Heart Scarves. One group made shoulder covers for oncology patients, another gathered backpacks for school children, some groups made baby gowns for some overseas projects and another for a local group.

We, Presbyterian Women do many missions. Everyone who attended the Churchwide Gathering in Louisville this summer saw many mission ideas. We also contributed over \$60,000 in gift cards for the Bellwood Children's Home and the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Program. Presbyterian Women contribute greatly to the missions of the PC(USA) as well.

It is a Global Exchange because the following year, a group of women from the same part of the world are invited to attend the Churchwide Gathering to tell their stories to their North American sisters.

While in Glens Falls, Jana shadowed Gloria and witnessed what life is like in America. Jana was one of the guests that was sponsored by the Synod of the Northeast Presbyterian Women. It was an honor and a privilege to be asked to be a host to a Global Exchange Partner. We may be worlds apart but the love of Jesus gave us common ground. Through our faith, a handprint was placed forever in our hearts. We met as strangers at the Albany Airport and we parted as sisters in Christ with the knowledge that we are not so different after all. I hope to be able to visit Jana and her family in the near future. This was an experience that I will never forget and I will cherish for the rest of my life.

PW Gathering Includes Synod Partnership Guest from Madagascar

The four-day triennial Churchwide Gathering of Presbyterian Women, entitled God Will Do Wonders Among You, lived up to its name. I had been told to expect great things. I found that the women, from many walks of life and many parts of the nation and the world, had powerful stories, a lively sense of fun, and a strong commitment to healing the world. The title God Will do Wonders comes from the promise given to the Israelites in Joshua 3:5, as they are about to enter the Promised Land.

As a member of the Synod Committee on Partnership with Madagascar, I was especially pleased to host and share a room with Zoé Rasendrasahina, our guest from Madagascar who came to the USA last March after the coup in Madagascar. (The Synod of the Northeast and the PC(USA) brought her family to the United States for their safety.) Zoe's husband Lala Rasendrasahina, is President of the FJKM (the Church of Jesus Christ in Madagascar.) Zoe attended all of the sessions and enjoyed seeing her countrywoman Ivaline Lalanirina Ramahefarivo and several other women who had come to the conference from around the world as Global Partners.

A wide range of workshops, forums and plenary sessions were offered along with a bookstore, and an exhibit hall which hosted many Presbyterian resources. The worship segments of the plenary were especially wonderful with 2500 hundred women singing hymns old and new – led by Tracy Keenan and Dave Powers. Preachers such as Margaret Aymer encouraged us to keep *meddlin'* in the search for justice and Cynthia Rigby reminded us that sometimes back talk is needed and is almost always more helpful than the alternative of complaining/gossiping behind another's back. We learned about the progress that is finally being made against human trafficking and how we can help from Carol Smolenski. The courage of Puah and Shiprah who both meddled and cleverly talked back to Pharaoh so that Hebrew babies might live, came to life in a wonderful production of *Puah's Midwife Crisis*.

Women of the Synod of the North East were well represented at the Gathering, filling a large room to enjoy lunch and conversation and to hear from Sandy Grillo, moderator of the PW of the Synod of the Northeast and several other women who spontaneously spoke about what was on their hearts

The end of April began weeks of testing and doctors' appointments. The first part of June, I was informed that I had stage 2 endometrial carcinoma (uterus cancer). I cannot tell you enough how much all of your prayers, e-mails, and cards have meant to me. Daily, I can feel all of your hugs and prayers.

Upon return from the Gathering, I had surgery and the doctors said they have removed it all. Next week, I go for a follow up doctor visit where he will discuss my future course, if needed.


